Welcome to the first edition of RDA Riverine-news for the financial year!

Last month RDA Riverina farewelled one of our committee members, Phil Pinyon. Phil has moved to take up a new role interstate and made a significant contribution to the RDA Riverina committee and economic development initiatives and activities across the region. We wish Phil and his wife Deb all the very best in their new pursuits.

The past year was a particularly busy one across the Riverina with a number of significant regional activities and funding announcements. Regional business expansion is set to continue with the Riverina Intermodal Freight hub receiving confirmation of State government funding to compliment the federal funding in the last two weeks. This will be a significant business enabler for the region and provide a much needed boost to business confidence. Coupled with a replacement of the Eunony bridge to the east of Wagga, this provides a HML route for heavy traffic into the Bomen industrial area and freight hub and relieves heavy vehicle congestion through the Wagga Wagga CBD.

In addition, there was confirmation of Commonwealth funding for flood mitigation and upgrading of the Wagga Wagga levee bank, a relocation of the McWilliams bottling plant in Griffith and plans for more than \$180 million in solar and energy efficient projects across the region.

RDA Riverina have been working closely with local government and business for some time now to progress these significant economic development initiatives and it's great to see them finally come to fruition.

This newsletter includes another RDA committee member profile, information on funding for softwood plantation expansion in the south west slopes, new tourism networks for regional NSW and Riverina 'Top Plates' a new initiative of RDA Riverina for the upcoming Taste Riverina Food Festival. Enjoy!

New Tourism Networks for Regional NSW

The NSW Government announced this week that they will invest \$43 million over four years in a major overhaul in the way regional and rural areas attract visitors, including the creation of six new Destination Networks throughout NSW.

The four new regional destination networks are:

- Destination Riverina Murray;
- Destination Southern NSW (including the Snowy Mountains and Far South Coast);
- Destination North Coast (from Mid-Coast to Tweed Heads including Lord Howe Island): and

The two Sydney Surrounds destination networks will include:

- Destination Sydney Surrounds North (including the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, and Hunter); and
- Destination Sydney Surrounds South (including the Southern Highlands Wollongong and Shoalhaven).

Other new initiatives include a regional conferencing unit within Destination NSW, an increase to the Contestable Pool of the Regional Visitor Economy Fund (\$3.5 million) and an increase to Regional Flagship Event Funding (\$4 million) over 4 years.

The new networks were created after consultation with 93 key industry associations and stakeholders on ways to improve the outcomes for the Regional NSW visitor economy.


