Seven master sculptors from across the globe will gather in Griffith, Riverina NSW this year to create beautiful stone sculptures. 

Did you know?

- The heart of the Australian prune industry is in the temperate areas of the MIA and Young which offer ideal conditions plum orchards.
- Around 60 growers produce up to 3,000 tonnes of premium quality Australian prunes every year.
- Not all plums are suitable to dry as prunes. The classic French D'Agen remains the ideal plum variety for drying because of its high level of natural sugars, the thickness of its skin, its ability to absorb liquid after drying and its intense flavour. The D'Agen is recorded as being imported into Australia as early as 1866; and at the time, prunes were seen as potentially "a great source of wealth to the country".
- Australian prunes are dried on the farms where they're grown. Growers pick in late summer

and early autumn, when the fruit has ripened and the sugar levels are high. The plums are picked very quickly using mechanical shakers and are immediately placed in large hot air tunnels for drying overnight. The picking and drying process is complete within 24 hours, with plums dried to one third of their original moisture content.

- Growers then supply their dehydrated product to processors, with prices dependent on gradable sized fruit. The major processors clearly label their packages with Australian Prunes or they use the Ausprune logo to differentiate between locally grown and imported product
